Translational Assessment Workshop

This workshop will teach participants how to assess the translational potential of projects (e.g. regulatory pathway, freedom to operate, intellectual property, etc.).

It will provide an overview of the main components of the development pipeline that affect the feasibility of translational research. By being aware of the major issues, including definition of the end-product and regulatory classification, target patient population, intellectual property, market structure and pipeline, participants will have more confidence in designing or selecting their projects for maximum potential impact.

Duration: 2 days

Minimum number of students: 10

Translational Assessment & Transferable Skills Workshop

This workshop will provide participants with the knowledge, philosophy and tools needed in translational research and also focuses on enhancing communication, presentation and listening skills.

Duration: 3 days

Minimum number of students: 10

Best practices in public-private collaboration Workshop

This workshop provides opportunity to learn and actively experience ways to form productive collaboration, especially focused on developing collaboration with industry.

The course includes business development, legal and financial strategies, project management and administration, and project reporting, delivered in a format emphasizing both interaction and an entrepreneurial approach.

Skills will be equally applicable whether students intend to pursue careers in academia, industry, or as life science or technology entrepreneurs. The course will be a mixture of content lectures from experts and case examples where students actively learn relevant skills as teams and individuals.

Duration: 2 days
